Justificativa:

A disciplina discutirá questões normativas suscitadas pelo fenômeno da pobreza. Serão abordadas diferentes abordagens filosóficas (utilitarismo, suficientarismo, *Ethical Poverty Line*, abordagem das capacidades, teorias do reconhecimento, abordagens deontológicas kantianas, abordagens baseadas sobre a noção de direitos humanos, teorias de gênero) e discutidos vários tópicos (argumentos normativos pela luta contra a pobreza, renda básica universal, aporofobia etc.).
